President's Message: Standing by our Library

Dear Friends,

April 6-12 was National Library Week. Three weeks prior, President Trump issued an executive

order to cut funding for the Institute of Museum and Library Services, a federal agency that grants monies for librarian training and innovative programming. In FY 2024, California received \$16 million for libraries through the IMLS Grant to States program, and \$1.8 million in other library grants.

The executive order is a direct attack on libraries everywhere, whether they receive IMLS funding or not. While we paused to appreciate National Library Week and applauded Berkeley Mayor Adena Ishii and the City Council for issuing a Proclamation recognizing the outstanding services and programs provided by the Berkeley Public Library,


let us remain vigilant and involved. Even though BPL is primarily locally funded and BPL's budget will remain stable even in the face of cuts to the IMLS, Library Director Tess Mayer says "this development

is still very concerning and we will continue to follow this situation as it unfolds."

In the meantime, support and use your Library!

Visit a branch, attend a program, check out a book that challenges your understanding of the world, thank a librarian, and join or renew your membership in the Friends. Write or call your elected representatives they are probably on the same wavelength, but every letter and call counts as a message from a constituent. 

After editing The Bookmark for many years, Sayre Van Young is passing the baton (or keyboard) to



The Story Time Band

The Story Time Band is the rock star of the stroller set! If you see a critical mass of strollers heading toward Freight & Salvage or one of Berkeley's parks,

you know that a performance by The Story Time Band is the destination. In 2013, children's librarian Michael Kwende, known to Berkeley youth as Mr. Michael, and retired librarian and guitarist Tim DeWolf, began offering Musical Story Time at the Berkeley Public Library's Claremont Branch. Their events soon became so popular with children and their caregivers that they outgrew the library's programming space, requiring them to secure a larger venue to accommodate their audiences.

That place became Berkeley's Bateman Mall Park, and soon after, musicians and library specialists Juan Castille and Donovan Russell joined the effort, and The Story Time Band was born. In 2024, the band welcomed a

new member, keyboardist Tienne Lee!

They have since brought their Musical Story Time to numerous elementary school classrooms, public libraries, and literacy events and have performed at

Berkeley elementary schools, Freight & Salvage and public parks throughout the city where hundreds of children and caregivers regularly attend their weekly Musical Story Time sessions. In 2021 the Band held five

events for a total audience of 167; by 2023

they had performed at 41 events for over 7,000 people! And their popularity is only growing.

The Friends of the Library are delighted that the funds for venue rental come out of the programming gift that we donate to the Library. We have also funded professional sound engineering services so that the Band can create a CD or post to a streaming service. If you have designated a donation to the Friends in honor of the Band, be assured that its financial future is secure. And, if you need a new BPL library card, you can select from many designs, including one for The Story Time Band. Now that's fame!
